[0:00] You're all very welcome to the service this evening. My name is George and I attend the church regularly here. Now not everyone I thought will be completely familiar with the structure of our time together tonight.

So I thought I would just let you know what the plan of action is. So shortly we'll start the service with a psalm which we'll sing in Gaelic and we'll sit to sing.

Then one of the deacons will pray and this will also be in Gaelic. We'll then stand to sing a hymn together before we read from the Bible.

And then we'll sing another hymn before I share some thoughts from a book in the Old Testament called Habakkuk. And the service will finish with a final hymn. So as we start our service, our first praise tonight is in Gaelic.

And we'll sit to sing. It's the first two stanzas of Psalm 105. Now let me practice my Gaelic. O huca buchachis doi iu, er einam saan gida feen.

[1:13] That's the first two stanzas in Gaelic in case you don't understand what that is. Let me read this in English though so that we know what we're singing. So it's Psalm 105.

Give thanks to God. Call on his name. To men his deeds make known. Sing ye to him. Sing psalms. Proclaim his wondrous works, each one.

See that ye in his holy name to glory do accord. And let the heart of everyone rejoice that seeks the Lord. So we sit to sing the first two stanzas of Psalm 105.
